



Green Party Structure People may become members of their state Green Parties, through whatever process each state party may have.



There are 150 seats on the GPUS National Committee (NC). State parties are represented proportionally in the NC, based on a formula that measures each party's relative size and strength. Affiliated caucuses also have representation on the NC.

GPUS Steering Committee (SC), along with the party's staff, oversees and helps execute the day-to-day administration and operations of the party.

The Global Greens are organized into four federations, in the Americas, Africa, Europe and Asia-Pacific.

The Green Party's political philosophy is guided by its Ten Key Values, shared by Green Party organizations around the world:

Grassroots Democracy Social Justice Ecological Wisdom Nonviolence Decentralization **Community-Based Economics** Feminism and Gender Equity Respect for Diversity Personal and Global Responsibility **Future Focus and Sustainability**



1. Grassroots Democracy

The powerless suffer the most from resource depletion and toxic pollution.

All human beings must be allowed a say in decisions that affect their lives. We also work to create new types of political organizations that expand the process of participatory democracy by directly including citizens in decision-making.

2. Social Justice And Equal Opportunity Greens want to replace the worldwide system of poverty and injustice with a world free of all oppression

As a matter of right, all persons must have the opportunity to benefit equally from the resources afforded us by society and the environment.



3. Ecological Wisdom

The Greens recognize that the Earth sustains all life processes.

Human societies must function with the understanding that we are part of nature, and support a sustainable society that utilizes resources in such a way that future generations will benefit and not suffer from the practices of our generation.

4. Non-Violence

Greens reject violence as a way of settling disputes

We are working to create a world where war is obsolete

It is essential that we develop effective alternatives to society's current patterns of violence. We will work to demilitarize and eliminate weapons of mass destruction, and will take actions toward lasting global peace.



Wealth

5. Decentralization

Power and responsibility must be restored to local communities within an overall framework of ecologically sound and socially just values and lifestyles.

Centralization of wealth and power contributes to social and economic injustice, environmental destruction, and militarization. We seek a restructuring of social, political and economic institutions.

6. Community-Based Economics Greens seek a new economics that is based upon the natural limits of the Earth

We support redesigning our work structures to encourage employee ownership and workplace democracy. We support restructuring our patterns of income distribution. We support restricting the size and concentrated power of corporations without discouraging superior efficiency or technological innovation.

7. Feminism And Gender Equity

The Green movement is profoundly inspired by feminist values. The ethics of cooperation and understanding must replace the values of domination and control over others.

We have inherited a social system based on male domination of politics and economics. We call for the replacement of the cultural ethics of domination and control with cooperative ways of interacting that respect differences of opinion and gender.

8. Respect For Diversity

Greens honor the biological diversity of the Earth and the cultural and spiritual diversity of Earth's people.

We believe it is important to value cultural, ethnic, racial, sexual, religious and spiritual diversity. We encourage respect for all life forms, and increased attention to the preservation of biodiversity.

9. Personal And Global Responsibility

Greens demonstrate a commitment to global sustainability and international justice through political solidarity and in personal lifestyles based on self-sufficiency and living lightly.

We seek to join with people and organizations around the world to foster peace, economic justice, and the health of the planet.






10. Future Focus And Sustainability

Greens seek a society where the interests of seven generations from now are considered equal to the interests of the present generation. We must reclaim the future for our children and ourselves.


Our actions and policies should be motivated by long-term goals. We must make the quality of all lives, rather than open-ended economic growth, the focus of future thinking and policy.


